



PRIMARY CAMPUS UNIFORM AND PERSONAL PRESENTATION

The St Michael's College uniform exists to help students grow with a sense of identity and pride within the community and should be worn as described herein at all times. For the purpose of comfort, there is a two week period of interchangeability both at the end of Term 1 and the beginning of Term 2, and at the end of Term 3 and the beginning of Term 4, where students may wear either the winter or summer uniform in its entirety dependent on weather.

Summer Uniform Terms 1 and 4

Summer dress, worn to the knee with white crew socks (navy bike shorts may be worn underneath)

Short sleeve white shirt with crest

Navy shorts (pull on or belt loops) worn with white crew socks or grey trousers worn with grey or black crew socks

Blue St Michael's jumper (if required)

Black leather traditional school shoes - polished (refer to notes)

Cooler weather - alternative uniform permitted, refer to College uniform Terms 2 and 3



Winter Uniform Terms 2 and 3

Long or short sleeve white shirt with crest, must be tucked in during Terms 2 and 3

College tie (adjustable looped ties for Early Primary students, refer to notes for resizing), top button on shirt must be done up

Blue St Michael's jumper with crest

Skort (shorts with outer skirt) worn with navy tights or white long socks, tunic (navy bike shorts may be worn underneath) worn with navy tights or white long socks

Grey trousers worn with grey socks and black belt (if required)

Blazer (Year 5 and 6 only) - worn to and from school

Plain white singlet or t-shirt may be worn as an undershirt (skivvies are not permitted)

Black leather traditional school shoes - polished (refer to notes)



Physical Education Uniform for Practical Lessons in Winter and Summer

St Michael's sports polo top

St Michael's navy sport shorts

St Michael's rugby top

St Michael's navy track pants

Plain white sports socks or SMC monogrammed socks

St Michael's wide brimmed hat (for outdoor activities)

Optional items: St Michael's softshell jacket

Runners

Students to come to school dressed and remain in their sports uniform on days of designated PE lessons. Class teachers will advise students of designated PE days.



Additional Information

The official school bag must be used.

Hats are required during Terms 1 and 4 (no hat is required when playing under cover only). Hats are optional during Terms 2 and 3. Due to hygiene reasons students cannot borrow hats.

Reception to Year 4 do not require a blazer.

The softshell jacket is for sports or protective attire in cooler weather. It does not replace the blazer or jumper.

The dress code for special occasions and school events, such as College photo day, whole Campus Mass and Academic Assemblies is the full College uniform (no sports attire). Students will be advised of this expectation prior to all such events.

Hair

Hair is to be clean, neat and tidy, out of the eyes and without extremes of colour or style (free of multi-coloured streaks, patterns and large patches of different colour).

Clipper cuts should not be less than number three.

No razor cuts/lines or patterns cuts into the hair. Undercuts, long fringe, top knot/bun are non-compliant.

No cutting/shaving/gelling/tinting of the hair that leads to a Mohawk style.

No 'rats' tails or mullet styles.

Hair longer than the bottom of a shirt/top collar must be of similar length all over and tied back.

All hair ties, scrunchies and ribbons must be the same colour as hair or College colours - blue, maroon and gold. A striped College ribbon may be worn.

Please err on the conservative side when considering changes to hair styles to ensure students comply with College expectations.

Jewellery

One small stud or sleeper in each ear.

Nail Polish

Nail polish is not permitted.
